Multidisciplinary Comprehensive Rehabilitation Following Laryngectomy

About the program: Although the goal of every clinician is organ preservation, a total laryngectomy is often unavoidable in patients with advanced stage laryngeal and hypopharyngeal cancer or recurrent disease. Fortunately, the quality of life following a total laryngectomy is very good provided surgical and rehabilitation efforts are optimal. Over the last several decades considerable progress in voice, pulmonary and olfaction rehabilitation of the total laryngectomy patient has been made. A cadaver resection lab offers attendees a unique and powerful learning experience in surgical techniques for total laryngectomy.
